Zentangle: Repetition, Pattern and Rhythm

For this assignment you will concentrate on the repetition of *shapes* and *lines* to create a *pattern*. Zentangles are made up of patterns. In turn, patterns have lights and darks, called *values*. The patterns will become much easier as you go, but the challenge is how you combine them to create visual interest. When several patterns are drawn in close proximity to each other, they form a *texture*. Textures also invite the eye to move around the page, which is called *rhythm* and *movement*.

Elements: Line, shape, value. Texture

Principles: Rhythm, Movement

Create a zentangle design on a 9" X 12" piece of paper using a minimum of *ten different patterns*. Create a 1" border on your paper, and work within the rectangular shape of the paper, or create your own shape to work in. You may search the internet for ideas. Having completed a minimum of 10 sketches of 10 pattern examples for practice, as well as classwork research, you will be familiar with the use of patterns in a variety of different kinds of art.

What's due:

Practice: patterns in your sketchbook, 1/4 page each.

Assignment: 9" X 12" finished design, with 1" inch border.
