Assignment Photo 1: Portraiture Photography

Overview: In this assignment students will explore portrait photography. Students will apply their knowledge of composition, framing, angles and depth of field, and lighting while photographing people. Students will look at portraits by various photographers. Students will *borrow strategies used by these artists* to create a series of portraits that capture the distinctive character of their subject/s.

Project Requirements: *PLEASE PAY ATTENTION AND FOLLOW INSTRUCTION

- Students will photograph 4 people. At least one of your subjects must be outside of school + class time. No more, and no less.
- Students will shoot a minimum of 10 visibly *different* images of EACH PERSON; spend time with that person, get to know them and find the best way to portray *who they are* through your images.
- Projects could tell a story about your subject or it may document an event/activity that the person is involved in, it may be a simple close-up, an action photo, or softly lit.
- Students will photograph each person in different types of lighting, style, background, composition, aperture. Be prepared to identify the lighting.
 - 1. Natural Light in an outside environment.(a defined setting or surrounding)
 - 2. Studio Light with backdrop. (simplified background)
- Everyone should consider and apply the implementing good composition in photography when shooting.

PROJECT TIPS: What NOT to do (All of these things will lose you points):

DO NOT submit photographs that you took prior to this assignment

DO NOT crop your photos. Frame the portrait while photographing.

DO NOT use animals as your subject (You can include an animal in a portrait, but it should not be the main subject)

Angles, subject matter, framing, lighting and composition is repetitive and unimaginative in most of the photographs. The student is missing photographs. 10 = Photographs are unoriginal and uninspired. Angles, subject matter, composition, framing, lighting show no variety and little consideration. 4. CLASSROOM SKILLS and BLOG 25 = Student respects class rules, time expectations and photography equipment. Student has posted all project and classwork correctly to classroom and blog. Blog posts include correct captions for all photographs and homework. 20 = Student shows reasonable respect for class rules, time expectations and photography equipment. Student has posted all project and classwork correctly to classroom and blog, but may have missing or incorrect captions in classroom and blog. 15 = Student sometimes does not follow class rules, time expectations and photography equipment. Student is missing posts or captions to classroom and blog.
