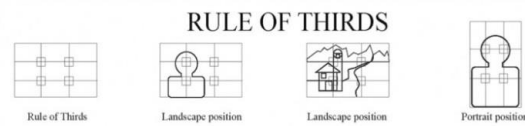


- You will be taking a total of 10 photographs for Part I of your classwork. Please use your imagination and follow the instructions below.



1. Take a photograph that follows the Rule of Thirds in a Landscape/Horizontal Position – show the movement of a person through the picture frame
 - Exposure time: 1"-2" second exposure time
2. Take a photograph of a person that follows the Rule of Thirds in a Vertical/Portrait Position
 - Exposure time: 3"-5" second exposure time
3. Take a photograph that uses edge framing in Landscape/Horizontal Position. The subject of object on the edge must move at some point during the exposure.
 - Exposure time: 1"-2" second exposure time
4. Take a photograph that uses edge framing in the Vertical/Portrait Position. The subject of object on the edge must move at some point during the exposure.
 - Exposure time: 3"-5" second exposure time
5. Take a photograph that uses motion to show directional line in Landscape/Horizontal Position.
 - Exposure time: 1"-2" second exposure time
6. Take a photograph that that uses motion to show directional line in the Vertical/Portrait Position.
 - Exposure time: 3"-5" second exposure time
7. Take a tight/close framed photograph of an object/person that is moving in Landscape/Horizontal Position.
 - Exposure time: 5"-10" second exposure time
8. Take a tight/close framed photograph of an object/person that is moving in the Vertical/Portrait Position.
 - Exposure time: 5"-10" second exposure time
9. Take a photograph of a frame within a frame in Landscape/Horizontal Position. The subject in the frame must be moving.
 - Exposure time must be between 5" - 30" seconds
10. Take a photograph of a frame within a frame in Vertical/Portrait Position. The subject in the frame must be moving.
 - Exposure time must be between 5" - 30" seconds
